

## Make The Commitment

 Make the Commitment can supply RFMOs with better data, reduce bycatch and guarantee observer coverage.

 ISSF has identified over twenty-five commitments to be met over the next three years.

## The First Commitment

 The first ISSF commitment called on industry to end the practice of atsea transshipments for purse seine vessels.

\*We've urged tuna regional fisheries management organizations to close loopholes.

## **Upcoming Commitment**

Beginning next year, we're asking vessels to make the commitment to report all tuna and bycatch to RFMO scientific bodies, as well as indicate whether the bycatch was retained or discarded, dead or alive.

### **PVR Monitoring**

The cost to each vessel covers an important part of the ProActive Vessel Register – monitoring for compliance. ISSF has contracted with an independent third party to audit the information submitted by vessels, with additional field audits beginning in 2013.

### **PVR Promotion**

The ProActive Vessel Register will be promoted worldwide, specifically targeted to processors, traders, importers, retailers and eNGDs. ISSF will use online, social media and email marketing, along with press outreach, to promote the PVR and provide free access to its searchable database.
